Love has built all the best things in our lives; family, friends, neighborhoods, churches, valued businesses, great schools, and can build a city.

We offer not a program but a Person, not advice but an Advocate, not a handout but a hand, not a cause but a community. Each person is not defined by their needs, but by how much we need each other, here in Roanoke.

Every day we wake up and pray that God's kingdom will come, His will be done, right here in our Roanoke neighborhoods. Together, we can learn to know His love and forgiveness and share it with one another. We will see Him restore broken relationships with Him, ourselves, our community and our work. LOOKING AHEAD

2021 holds much to be excited about. God is doing a great work in the Roanoke Valley, and we are thankful that you get to be a part of it. Where will you make a difference in 2021?

Jobs for Life classes at the Rescue Mission of Roanoke start in February 2021 while developing a second class open to all in the community. Would your church like to host a **Faith and Finances** class, a financial education class for anyone but especially for those living on the poverty line.

We are partnering with local churches for Helping Without Hurting workshops. Learn how the local church can work to alleviate poverty through Christ-centered relationships.

We are working with several national organizations to launch a web-based platform that will **connect families to**advocates and resources in their community.

We continue to offer training for church-based **English teachers** and assistance to churches who are starting or restarting their English program for internationals.

As the number of refugees, asylees, and international students increases, we are committed to equipping the local church to be on **the front lines of welcoming** them with Christ's love
